PROJECT SCOPE

Insulated aluminium rainscreen overcladding and replacement windows to three elevations delivered in two phases to meet client needs. In addition to the demands of keeping the library operational at all times, the building also housed a bank and other service businesses at ground level which required uninterrupted access in order to maintain business continuity. Despite these severe constraints, expert access planning and design of temporary works including protective scaffold tunnels robust enough to support point loads of mastclimbers enabled the whole project to be delivered with minimal disruption to building users.
